## A 1 DAY EQUALS 24 HOURS

### Definition 1 Day Equals 24 Hours








A day is 24 hours. The Earth spins around once every day.

A day has 2 parts: **day** and **night**.



## B ORDER OF THE DAY

### Definition Order of the Day

## C DAYS OF THE WEEK

### Definition Days of the Week

There are 7 days in a week:

**Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday**

## D MONTHS OF THE YEAR

### Definition Months of the Year

There are 12 months in a year:

**January, February, March, April, May, June, July, August, September, October, November, December**

## E DAYS IN A MONTH

### Definition Days in a Month

Each month has a special number of days:

- Most months have **31 days**: January, March, May, July, August, October, December.
- Some months have **30 days**: April, June, September, November.
- February has **28 days**. It's the shortest month!

### Definition A Calendar

A **calendar** is a chart that shows the days and months of a year. It helps us keep track of time!

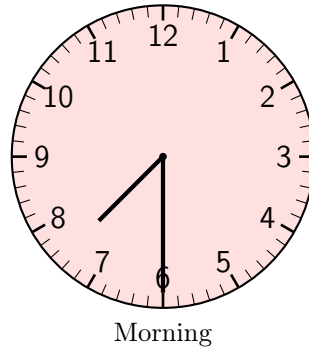

## F READING CLOCK FOR HALF-HOUR INTERVALS

### Method Reading Clock for Half-Hour Intervals

- **Hours:** The little hand points to the hour. Look at the number it's on. If it's between two numbers, choose the smaller one.
- **Minutes:** The big hand points to the minutes. Look at the number it's on. If it's on 12, it's 0 minutes (o'clock). If it's on 6, it's 30 minutes (half past).

**Ex:** What time does this clock show?



*Answer:*

- The little hand points between 7 and 8. We pick the smaller one, so it's 7. That's the hour.
- The big hand points to 6. That means 30 minutes.
- It's morning, so the time is 7:30 in the morning.
